<u>NEW MEDICAL VALIDITY PERIODS FOR PILOTS AND OTHER FLIGHT CREW</u> <u>MEMBERS REQUIRING AVIATION MEDICALS</u>

Consequent upon the passage of a new Civil Aviation Act, together with new Civil Aviation Regulations conforming to the revised international civil aviation standards. The medical validity periods of pilots and other flight crew members require aviation medicals have been modified.

The issuance of the new medical validity periods of pilots and other flight crew members requiring aviation medicals will take effect from 1st January 2008.

- Note.1 The periods of validity listed above are based on the age of the applicant at the time of undergoing the medical examination.
- Note 2.— The period of validity will, for the last month counted, include the day that has the same calendar number as the date of the medical examination or, if that month has no day with that number, the last day of that month.
